All of the KS1 novels are short and could easily be read in less than 3 weeks, some are even achievable in a week or less. This enables class teachers to either supplement with picture books, non-fiction based on topics or class interest alternatively, there is scope to try new releases or additional older favourites (teachers to be mindful of racist/disablist tropes in older books – eg Enid Blyton and Roald Dahl – if in doubt google or ask someone else)

These books cover – Asian heritage, mental health and confidence/self-belief. The authors are also diverse. Featuring authors of Asian and Jewish heritage, LGBQT+ representation and a mixture of male and female authors. Other cultures and disabilities are covered by the rest of the ks2 reading spine and supplemented by picture books.
