As a child I enjoyed reading as a way to experience adventures that I would be too scared to do in real life - I was scared of a LOT of things when I was young! As an adult I love to read as it helps me to relax and get away from the trials and tribulations of a busy life as a teacher and a mum.


Do you have a favourite book character?

"Claude is a silly, cheeky dog that is lots of fun!" - Georgia 5MGL


Tom has brilliant plans for his two weeks off school. Unfortunately, both the dentist and his annoying sister are standing in his way!
