Huge congratulations to Audrey who joined us recently in Y4. She wrote a book for a national Shakespeare Week Competition last year which received nearly a 1000 entries and was Highly Commended. The Shakespeare Trust has now acquired the book as part of their permanent collection, and it will be kept for future generations to see how Shakespeare inspired in the past. The book will be preserved under special conditions alongside other Shakespeare artefacts. Last





week Audrey was invited to present the book to the Trust where she met author, illustrator and patron of the trust Marcia Williams. What an incredible achievement.

Well, that was an exciting term. We've had so many activities and developments within school, here's a quick round up on what we've been up to!

Our Mother's Day Shop was once again the busiest shop in town – selling and wrapping over 1000 gifts in just 2 days. The junior hall became Saffron Walden's social hub with a buzzing KS2 disco and then jammed with over 100 quizzers vying for this year's trophy (the PTA team were embarassingly more in wooden spoon territory!). And cramming activities into the very last minute, the weather just about held out this morning for our annual **Easter Egg Hunt** - with over 600 children searching for clues to be rewarded with a little Easter treat from the PTA.



In other news we are delighted to have been able to make some significant spending. As if by magic, a new adventure **Trim Trail** appeared on the field - adding a wonderful new activity for outdoor play. We are proud to have donated over £6500 to fund this and love the feedback from the children about how popular it is.



We have also pledged £8,000-£10,000 in funding towards extra-curricular trips across the school. Each year group has planned their own activities (some still to come) resulting in children practising their circus skills, experiencing Zoolab, being treated to a Shakespeare play with further trips planned to Colchester Zoo, Epping Forest, Celtic Harmony Camp and Astra Zeneca on the horizon.

Teachers haven't been forgotten with £2,100 donated across all classes to spend on what they most need. Games, books, puzzles, bookcases, chalk paints, colouring pencils and even Yoto audio players have all been purchased and will be brightening up classroom activities and play.

And we wouldn't be a Gold Rights Respecting School if we didn't also let the children have their say and share of funds! So, with the help of Mrs Brown, a whole school survey was conducted to ask the children what they'd like to spend £2100 on too. We loved reading all the responses from each class and with the help of Mrs Brown and the School Council, we are busy fulfilling requests to even further improve play-times from new balls and nets to giant outdoor games and then more investigative play with bug hotels and much more! We'll keep you posted with our purchases.

Summer term is our favourite, with the Summer Fayre, RAB Fest_and lots more. We'll be kicking off with another KS2 Disco on Wednesday 24th April - more information will be sent after Easter.
