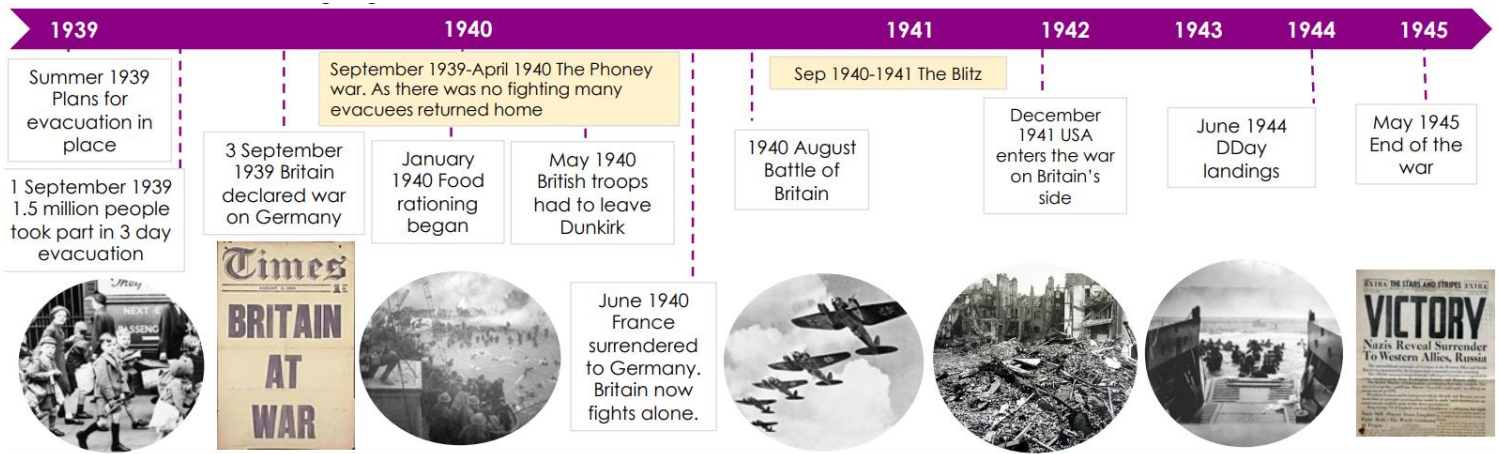


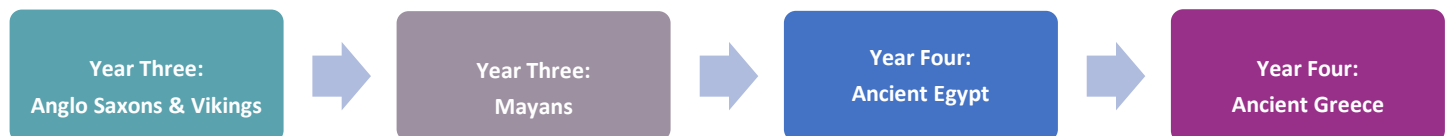

## Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
<b>Appeasement</b>	The act of giving the opposing side an advantage that they have demanded, in order to prevent further disagreement
<b>Allies</b>	Countries which fought on the British side (including: USA, Great Britain, France, Russia (1941-1945))
<b>Axis</b>	Countries which fought on the German side (including: Italy, Germany, Japan, Russia (1939-1941))
<b>Primary Evidence</b>	Original letters, diaries, photographs, recordings, films from the period being studied
<b>Secondary Evidence</b>	Evidence that has been reproduced from an original document e.g. a photocopy, a film about an event or information that can be found in a non-fiction book
<b>Evacuation</b>	Removal of people from a dangerous place due to a disaster or impending war
<b>Rationing</b>	Limiting the amount of scarce items people are allowed to have (usually food, clothing and fuel)
<b>Propaganda</b>	Spreading of information in order to influence public opinion and to manipulate other people's beliefs
