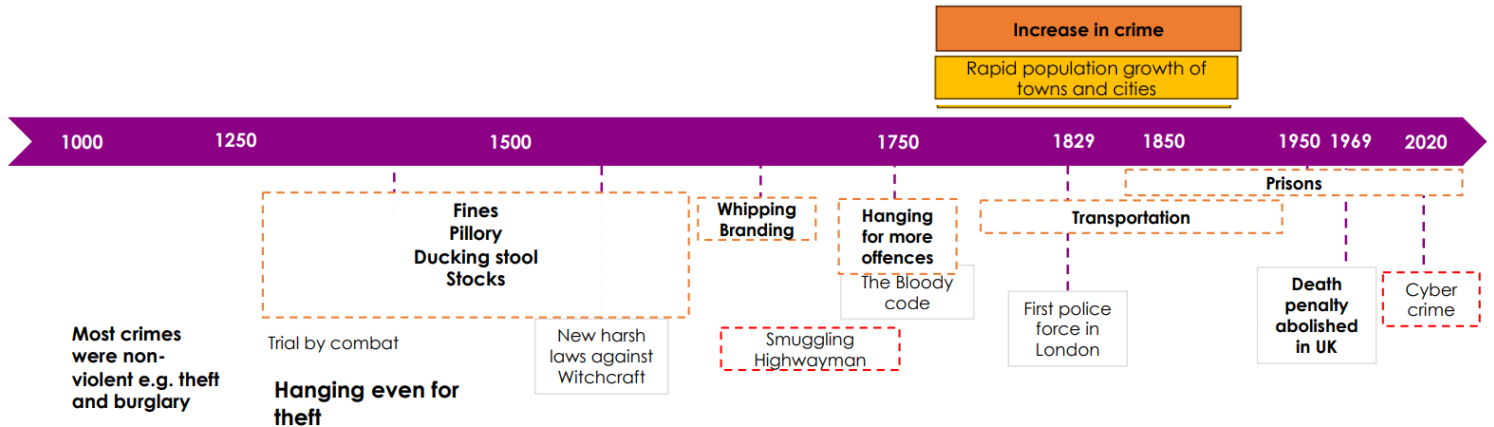




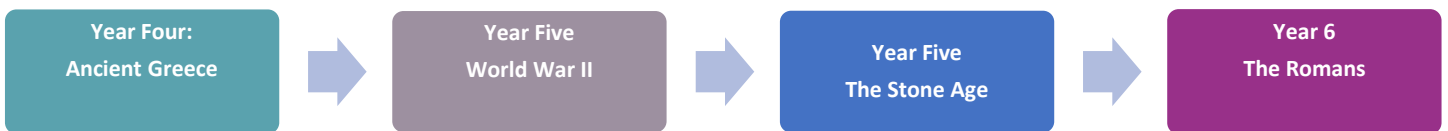

Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
Capital punishment	Killing someone as a punishment for their crime.
Offender	A person who has committed a crime.
Deterrent	Something that discourages an individual from performing an action (such as committing a crime)
Conviction	Being found guilty of a crime
Transportation	A form of punishment that meant the offender was sent abroad, usually to the Colonies.
Trial	A meeting in a court, at which evidence is presented, and a decision made, on whether an individual committed a crime.
Judge	A person who is in charge of a serious trial and decides what punishment a criminal gets.
Jury	The twelve men, and in modern times women, in a court who decide if someone is guilty of a crime.
Magistrate	A person who is in charge of a trial that's not as serious.
Sentence	The punishment given by a court for breaking a law.
