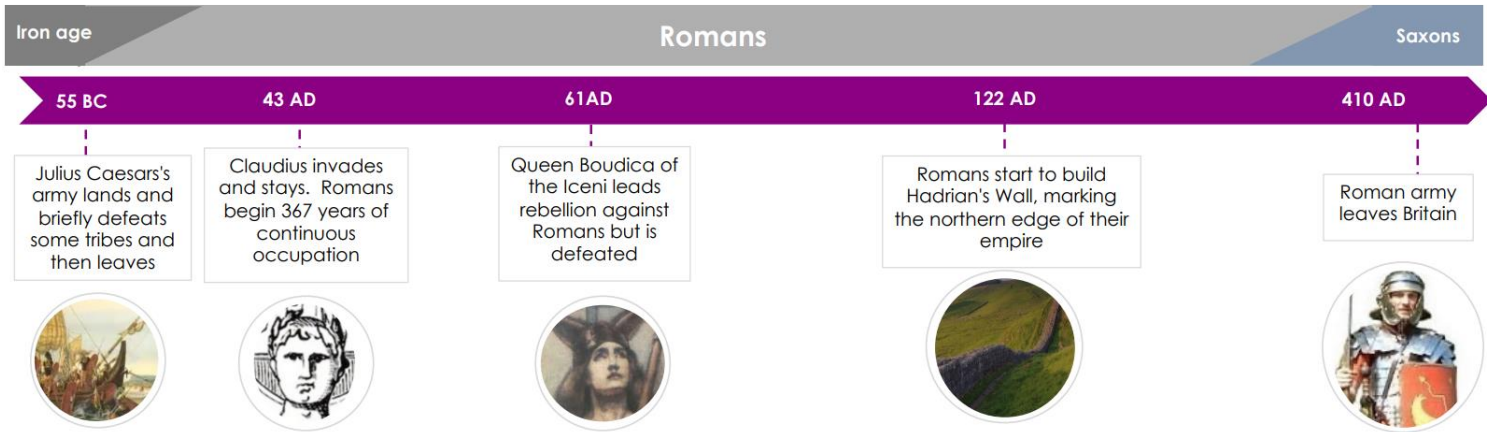


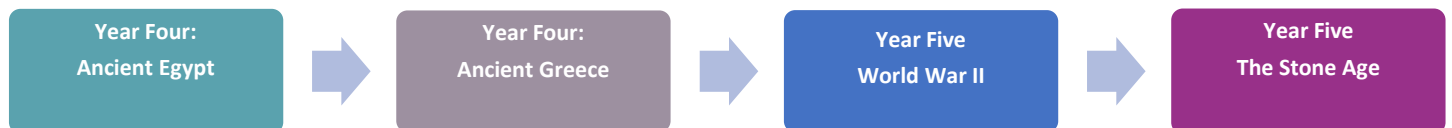

## Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
<b>Empire</b>	Large areas of land ruled over by a single ruler
<b>Emperor</b>	The leader of an empire
<b>Caesar</b>	Roman title meaning the same as Emperor
<b>Legion</b>	The largest unit in the Roman army which contains 5000 men
<b>Rebellion</b>	An act of armed resistance towards an established government or leader
<b>Taxes</b>	Money people pay to the government
<b>Legionary</b>	A soldier in the Roman army
<b>Legacy</b>	Something left or handed down
<b>Civilization</b>	The term used to describe the stage of human, social and cultural development and organisation that is considered to be very advanced
<b>Archaeology</b>	The study of human history and prehistory through the excavation of sites and the study of artefacts and other physical remains
